A Land Acknowledgement By Geof Thompson

Listen to the people on whose traditional lands we gather:

And that we acknowledge that we are on the traditional lands of The

Neutral peoples, who once lived and loved here. And in the surrounding

Territory of the vital peoples are here and now; The Mississauga of the New

Credit First Nation, the Haudenosaunee Six Nations, the Erie, and the Huron-Wendat.

The territory is mutually covered by the Dish With One Spoon Wampum Belt Covenant – an ancient law about how nations live together and share the land, all eating out of one dish. We give thanks for the opportunity to have our farm, and our Annual show on their territory. (Acknowledging the Territory, is something we do as settlers, part of the way we are together with one another and as a small step toward reconciliation. Of course, this is not our only task in working toward reconciliation – that involves more than words. However, in naming the nations that were, and ARE vibrantly here, on this land before our settler ancestors arrived, we acknowledge the principle of kinship to the land, and this helps to define how settler people see ourselves in relationship with First Nations Peoples).
