N.A.P.A. UPDATES FROM YOUR SECRETARY:

The budget for 2014 is completed and was passed out at the January General Meeting.

A Curators Committee was appointed by the executives. Karl Fretz, Bob Trendel, Carl Booth and Roger Robert have agreed to be on the committee. When an item is offered to the club it will be referred to the committee and they will assess

the item and decide if we should accept the item or not. They will try to get any history when they assess the item. Then they will take their recommendation to the executives and they will review their recommendations and take it to the membership at the next general meeting for a vote.

Ed Horton was appointed by the executives to manage the show grounds and is doing a great job. He is the person to go to if there is a problem on the grounds that needs attention. He will check it out and set up work crews to get the issue taken care of or he will bring it to the executives to see what they want done about the problem. The show grounds are a work in progress. The new covered bridge connecting the show grounds and the camp grounds is complete, what an awesome job was done and a big thank you to all who worked on this master piece. The pole shed has been cleaned out and stone was placed on the ground and it will be cemented in the spring when the weather permits. The electrical upgrades have been done and the roofs on the Blacksmith Shop, Log Cabin and Memorial Buildings are complete thanks to our Ontario Trillium Grant and our member's hard work. Thanks to everyone who helped with the electrical upgrade and the roofing projects. The doors have been placed on the saw mill building. The railing on the porch of the Log Cabin has now been completed. Dan Roscoe is working on putting up a safety shield at the saw mill.

It was voted to donate to the Niagara South Plowing Match again this year.

The Niagara Square Demonstration is not happening this year.

Karl Fretz and Allan Ursacki volunteered and have audited the financial books.

The members were asked if anyone had a corn sheller they would donate or sell to the Conservation Authority to be used at their events. Karl Fretz said he had one he would donate to them. Thanks Karl.
