47[™] ANNUAL HERITAGE DISPLAY INFO:

The Lean-to will be complete and displays will be set up, hopefully with the History of the item attached. Sid Birdsey's daughter donated her father's tool display to the show and we are planning to place it on the walls of the lean-to. The special feature area will be displaying Oliver, Cockshutt and Hart Par tractors and equipment. The members chose to place on the plaque the Oliver Cletrac HG which has a history in this area and with Niagara Antique Power members. The 1947 Oliver was first used by the Erie Peat Co., working on a large peat bog and peat processing operation in Wainfleet, Ontario. This Oliver was one of the 12 Cletrac crawlers used to extract peat from the bog. In 1966 the tractor was sold by Erie Peat to John and Bruce Mittlestead (members of Niagara Antique Power Association) of nearby Bethel, Ontario. The Mittlestead brothers ran the Bethel Sawmill and were contracted to clear local bush lots (small wooded lands). This Oliver was used for skidding the logs out to the road where the logs were loaded and taken to the Bethel Sawmill. The HG Oliver because of its light weight and maneuverability was a great as set in working the muddy bush lots without destroying the forest floor. The Mittlestead brothers retired the Oliver Cletrac from working at the sawmill in the early 70ties and was housed at John Mittlestead's farm at 1903 Miller Rd Port Colborne. They started taking it to the Niagara Antique Power Association Heritage Display in Sherkston and displayed it for many years. In 2008 Brian Minor (member of Niagara Antique Power Association purchased it from Jim Mittlestead who inherited it from his father John Mittlestead. Brian Minor sold it to Ria and Jack Fyke known as the Fyke Team who worked hard to restore the Oliver to its original appearance. Everyone should be asking anyone they know to bring a special feature item to the show.
